Earn Your Bachelor's Degree in Integrated Design

Highline College's Bachelor of Applied Science in Integrated Design is an affordable two-year program that will engage you in multiple areas of design practice. You will specialize in a specific design discipline while exploring what it means to be a multidisciplinary designer. Highline offers the following specializations:

Graphic Design – Create visual concepts to communicate information. Create everything from posters and billboards to packaging and marketing materials.

Multimedia Design – Create digital art and interactive content for video games, web content, commercials, TV, and film.

Interior Design – Make indoor spaces functional, safe, and beautiful by determining space requirements and selecting essential and decorative items, such as colors, lighting, and materials.

Drafting Design – Prepare technical drawings and plans, learn specialized software to convert architectural architect and engineering drawings into technical drawings.

All classes are in the **evening with virtual (Zoom) options** to support your busy lifestyle!

CAREER OUTLOOK

In King County, the median advertised salary for design professionals with bachelor's degrees is \$65,000 per year. Job growth holds steady; regional job growth is higher than the national average. (Lightcast, 2023)

PROGRAM COST: \$14,772 plus books and other fees, or about half of what you would pay at a state university such as UW-Tacoma.

PROGRAM LENGTH: Two years for full-time students. (Full-time is 12 credits or more)

PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY: Completed a regionally accredited AAS or AAS-T degree with a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or better.
